First Responder: Tactical Interdiction of Mass Transit Terrorist Threats

This program of instruction is specifically designed for law enforcement personnel who have the responsibility of providing mass transit security and protection duties. Upon successful completion of this course the officer shall be able to safely and efficiently operate as a team member to detect, counter and mitigate terrorist threats against mass transit systems according to the Department of Homeland Security Target Capabilities List and the Universal Task List.

The course is a direct delivery program to the requesting agency’s jurisdiction. This decreases course cost and allows the officer to train on mass transit vehicles and platforms in which he or she operates on and around in the real world.

Instruction is conducted in a dynamic environment that challenges both the officer’s mental and physical skills. 70% of the course is comprised of hands on training, exercises and scenarios designed to engage the participant and add realism to the training.

Terrorist Threat Tactics Against Mass Transit

Identify potential targets, tactics, techniques and procedures associated with terrorist attacks against mass transit targets, based on known capabilities and historical precedence. Identify active threats and hazards unique to mass transit terrorist attacks in order to prevent, interdict, or mitigate risk.

Legal Considerations

Identify legal considerations impacting safe and effective decision making during the prevention, interdiction, and mitigation phases of response to a potential and/or active terrorist threat.

Information Collection

Collect, develop, and report information regarding potential terrorist attacks.

Threat Searches on Mass Transit

Develop and employ a search plan to identify suspicious items, WMD devices or reported suspects, followed by an appropriate evacuation plan.

Surveillance Detection

Develop and employ a surveillance detection plan to identify terrorist surveillance on mass transit facilities.

Threat Interdiction Tactics

List indicators and warnings that a terrorist attack is imminent and take the appropriate tactical procedures to interdict the threat.

Delivery

Course presentation includes classroom lecture, videos and extensive hands on exercises. Seventy percent of the curriculum is conducted in the field.





Tactical Solutions for Transit Police

Terrorist threat motivations and strategies at the tactical level (which is where the law enforcement officer operates) are to accomplish objectives of death, destruction and chaos.

From February 2004 through March 2009 there have been twenty significant terrorist attacks on mass transit vehicles worldwide. These attacks resulted in 848 fatalities and 3778 wounded commuters and security personnel.

TIMT3 examines terrorist threat tactics against mass transit systems and gives the officer

effective interdiction and response solutions.

Beginning with an in-depth look at terrorist attack methodologies the course moves through legal considerations for interdiction, early recognition of attack indicators, vehicle search methodologies, surveillance detection and culminates with two complete days of tactical interdiction training and exercises.

Officers will learn one, two and three person interdiction tactics for a variety of terrorist threats ranging from active shooter,

improvised explosive devices, chemical and biological attack, suicide bomber attack and combined threat attacks.

Tactics training takes place on actual mass transit vehicles and their respective support platforms, such as boarding areas.

Course size is limited to twenty four participants. This facilitates numerous exercise iterations for all officers. Scenarios employ numerous WMD training aids to heighten the officer's awareness and increase realism during the training.
